

NetLibrary's Media Center Windows 7 Workaround

Unfortunately, Media Center is currently not compatible with Windows 7 and Windows Media Player (WMP) 12. NetLibrary is working on compatibility and expects to be able to announce full compatibility or provide a target date for compatibility by the end of December.

In the meantime, you can use the Manual Download by downloading the eAudiobook and saving it on your PC.

There was a new option added under **Edit My Account**. Open your Internet browser:

- => Go to <<http://www.netlibrary.com>>
- => Login to NetLibrary
- => Click the Edit My Account link in the upper right hand corner of the screen
- => Scroll down the to Download Preference on the left side of screen
- => Uncheck the box "Use NetLibrary Media Center"
- => Click the "Save Changes" box
- => After you uncheck the box you will have the capability to download using the Manual Download.

To begin using the Manual Download, follow these directions.

Manual Download Options (Windows Media Player users)

Use this process to download an eAudiobook if you want to listen to it in Windows Media Player or transfer it to a portable device using Windows Media Player:

1. Click **Download this eAudiobook**.
2. Click **Check Out & Download CD Quality**.
Or, click **Check Out & Download Radio Quality** if you have a dial-up connection and will **not** listen to the eAudiobook on a portable listening device.
3. Log in to your account if prompted.
4. If the File Download window does not appear, your browser may have blocked it. In that case, follow your browser's instructions to download the blocked file.
5. In the File Download window, click **Save** and save the eAudiobook file on your computer in a location that you will remember.
6. On your computer, right-click on the eAudiobook file and select open with Windows Media Player to begin listening to the eAudiobook.

Note: You must begin listening to the eAudiobook to obtain a license to play it before disconnecting your Internet connection or you will be prompted to log in and obtain a license the first time you attempt to open the eAudiobook.

You can now listen to the eAudiobook in Windows Media Player or use Windows Media Player to transfer the eAudiobook file to a wide range of portable listening devices.
