MRESEARCH SHOWS THAT READING THROUGHOUT THE SUMMER IS A **POWERFUL WAY TO PREVENT THE** "SUMMER SLIDE," WHICH MAY BE **EVEN MORE PROFOUND THIS YEAR DUE TO LEARNING LOSSES ALREADY ASSOCIATED WITH THE COVID-19** PANDEMIC SCHOOL YEAR.

Summer Slide Facts:

- 2-3 months of reading skills can be lost over a single summer.
- Accumulated summer reading loss can equate to a two-year achievement gap by the time a student reaches middle school.




